

## Interactive U.S. Map Activity

Directions: Draw these features onto a map and label them with the correct number. On the back of the map, write the name of each feature.

1. This is the principle river of the U.S. It starts in Minnesota and flows south to the Gulf of Mexico through a huge delta in Louisiana.
2. This river is the longest river in the U.S. It stretches from Montana to meet the Mississippi River on the border between Illinois and Missouri.
3. This major mountain system in western North America extends more than 3,000 miles from central Northern Mexico to northwest Alaska.
4. This series of mountains, in the northeast of America, begins in Quebec, Canada and extends down to the coastal plains in Alabama.
5. This river starts in Pittsburgh where the Allegheny and Monongahela rivers converge. It flows southwest to enter the Mississippi River in Illinois.
6. This river is in the southwest U.S. It rises in northern Colorado and flows southwest into Mexico.
7. This mountain range rises mainly in eastern California and partly in western Nevada. It is about 400 miles long and between 50 and 80 miles wide.
8. This is the highest peak in the U.S. outside of Alaska. It is 1418 meters high and located in California.
9. The southwest coast of the U.S., from Florida to Texas, borders this body of water.
10. These mountains lie in northeastern New York State. They extend southward from the St. Lawrence River Valley and Lake Champlain to the Mohawk River Valley.
11. This is the largest of the Great Lakes. It borders Minnesota, Michigan and Wisconsin.
12. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest of the Great Lakes. It borders Michigan.
13. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest of the Great Lakes. It is bordered by Michigan, Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin.
14. This is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest of the Great Lakes. It is bordered by New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Michigan.
15. This is the smallest of the Great Lakes. It borders New York.

16. This river starts in southwest Colorado and flows down through New Mexico. It flows around the border of Texas and into the Gulf of Mexico.
17. This is a large inlet of the eastern Pacific Ocean along the northwestern coast of Mexico. It is enclosed on the west by the mountainous peninsula of Baja California and on the east by the Mexican mainland.
18. This is a broad inlet of the North Pacific Ocean on the southern coast of Alaska.
19. This river rises in central Colorado and flows east to the Mississippi River. It flows through Kansas, Oklahoma and Arkansas.
20. This river rises in northern Texas and flows southeast to meet the Mississippi River in Louisiana. It creates the boundary between Texas and Oklahoma.
